“ I grew up in the James Monroe Housing projects in the Bronx, NY. My family, the Jenkins family was one of hundreds of families who moved in Monroe in the 1960/61. Across the street from Monroe is an elementary school, P:S. 100. P.S.100 was where met someone, Stephen Boardman, who for most of my childhood, became my best friend, and who has to this day remained like a brother to me. Growing up in Monroe, you didn't have one mother, the mother's of our friends were our mothers as well. Stephen and I became almost inseparable and I spent as much time at 800 Soundview Avenue, apt 10D (I think that's right) as I did my own apartment. Mrs. Boardman became my first second mother. I can still to this day hear her with heavy West Indian accent calling my name, or speaking to me and Steve about something we had gotten into. Mrs. Boardman treated me well, and was very nice, but she was no nonsense when she needed to be nonsense! I have plenty of found memories of spending time in the Boardman household with Mrs. Boardman and her family.



The Jenkins and Boardman families connection wasn't just limited to Steve and me. It was also the friendships of Steve and my brother Henry (RIP); Carol (RIP) and my brother Larry (RIP); Ricky (RIP) and my brother Joey (RIP); and Alice and my brother Mark. Mrs. Boardman was as much apart of the Jenkins family as any other of the Monroe mothers. Mrs, Boardman was a very positive influence on my early years, and for that I am eternally grateful. Mrs. Boardman's legacy lives on through her awesome, talented, loving, and successful family. She is loved, respected, and will be truly missed by all.
