Freddie G Williams, Sr. was born February 12, 1940 in Gordon, AL to the late David Lee Williams and Hettie Lee Bowers. He attended the public schools in Freehold New Jersey and graduated from the Freehold Public High School. Freddie enlisted in the US armed services special forces in mid 1960s and was sent to Vietnam. He was honorably discharged in 1970s. He served in the military for several years.

Freddie received his Evangelist Certificate from the African Methodist Episcopal Church in 2007 and 2009. At an early age, he received the Lord. He started playing the keyboards, piano, and organ later in life and was a great singer.
