BORDENTOWN – Leon M. Steed, 69, died unexpectedly August 14, 2019, at his residence. He was born October 27, 1949, in High Point, North Carolina, the son to Harold Franklin Sr. and Blanche (Steele) Steed.

Leon was a part of the last graduating class of William Penn High School, Class of 1968. He briefly attended North Carolina State before moving to New Jersey where he worked as a lineman for Ocean Spray, a custodian for Hightstown School System, a security guard for Seal Security, and a transport driver. He married his beloved wife, Marilyn Ganges-Steed, in 2006; though they'd been together for nearly 50 years by the time of his death. He was known for his ability to make friends with anyone he met, being an unintentional stand-up comedian, and loving on his grandchildren and dog.

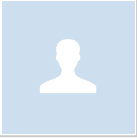
