### Obituary

Roosevelt worked for E.R. Squibb & Sons, New Brunswick, N.J. for more than 10 years in quality control. Together with his wife, Roosevelt owned and operated Eula Rose Catering Inc. in Highland

Park, N.J., a full service catering business that flourished for more than 20 years. In 1995 Roosevelt and Eula moved to Raleigh North Carolina where they lived until 2005. In 2005, Roosevelt and Eula moved to Monroe Township N.J. where Roosevelt lived until his death.

Roosevelt was joined in holy matrimony to the late Mrs. Eula Vick Bradley (nee Leftwich) on December 26, 1959. To this union two daughters were born. Rose Marie Bradley and Patricia Lea Bradley. Roosevelt is also survived by one grandson, Bradley M. Hudson.

Roosevelt lost his beloved wife Eula on May 10, 2010. Roosevelt was one of six children including his brothers Walter L. Bradley, Jr., and Frederick D. Bradley and his sisters Ollie May Taylor, Lula Mae Reed, and Clara L. Ramsey. Roosevelt is survived by a host of relatives, nieces, nephews, extended family and friends.
